# Barton Memorial Hospital Pediatric Medical Student Rotation Competency Based Goals and Objectives:

#### **Patient Care**

- Student will learn the techniques of a newborn pediatric examination appropriate for age of child
- Student will observe and assist with circumcision
- Student will observe newborn resuscitation as opportunity arises
- Students will observe acute pediatric care, as opportunity arises and general well child care

## **Medical Knowledge**

- Student will learn how to interpret growth charts and learn when to consider intervention
- Students will observe and learn about normal developmental milestones
- Student will learn about Periodicity Screening, the purpose, and how to look at screening forms to identify needs for intervention
- Student will learn about ACES and impact to health as an adult
- Immunization schedules and their importance

### **Practice Based Learning and Improvement**

- Students are expected to apply knowledge gained by reading and apply to the day-today care of patients.
- Students will have recommended reading as assigned by UNR Medical School that will focus on diseases and pathology that they will encounter during the rotation.
- Students will be responsible for taking a thorough history, learning both complete and focused physical exams, and attempting to formulate management plans of patients during the rotation. They will have immediate guidance and supervision provided by the attending physicians.
- Students are expected to utilize the EMR

#### **Interpersonal and Communication Skills**

- Student will be exposed to the complexity of communication with parents who come from a wide variety of backgrounds and educational levels as well as experiences
- Students will be able to counsel parents on the importance of well child care, including vaccinations.
- Students are expected to work as a team with the other members of the healthcare system. They are expected to behave professionally, and to ensure timely communication regarding consultation of patients.
- Students are expected to attend multidisciplinary rounds if there are any inpatient pediatric patients
- Students are expected to communicate clearly with patients, using language that they can understand.
- Students will communicate effectively, and in a timely manner, with the attending regarding management of the patients.

## **Professionalism**

- Students will adhere to the hospital dress code
- Students are expected to lead by example and to continuously act in a professional manner.
- Students are expected to document within 24 hours of seeing a patient for attending review

## **Systems Based Practice**

- All charts will be completed within the timeframe set by the medical staff Bylaws at Barton Memorial Hospital
- Students will gain an understanding about how community resources and collaboration play an important role in the care of children and families
