Orthopedic Surgery Rotations:

Barton Health and its affiliated orthopedic medical group (Tahoe Orthopedic and Sports Medicine) are nationally recognized providers of comprehensive orthopedic medical services for patients and elite athletes. We are a community leader providing orthopedic care to Lake Tahoe and the surrounding communities. Barton is the sponsor of an ACGME accredited Orthopedic Sports Medicine Fellowship. Elective rotations are offered to qualified Medical Students with a comprehensive mix of surgical and clinic experience. Rotations will include experience in arthroscopy, trauma, and sports related injuries under the direction of attending faculty who are board certified orthopedic surgeons with sub-specialty certification in Sports Medicine. Rotations can be 4 to 8 weeks depending on the Medical Students preference and medical school requirement.

What is expected of a Medical Student on this Orthopedic Surgery Elective Rotation:

- -Be on time
- -Dressed appropriately in clinic with a lab coat
- -Be prepared for cases prior to the planned surgical cases
- -Be an active learner
- -Prioritize tasks and time management
- -Ask questions, seek knowledge

Cadaver/Anatomy Labs

Every month we provide either a Cadaver or Anatomy Lab. Anatomy labs are in our new Surgical Skills Lab in the Zephyr Cove office and Cadaver Labs are at the Lake Tahoe Surgery Center in Zephyr Cove.

Main learning objectives for Labs

<u>Basic Anatomy</u>: Fellows, Residents and Medical Students will review the basic anatomy of joints and extremities at regularly scheduled cadaver anatomy labs.

<u>Surgical Landmarks & Approaches</u>: Fellows, Residents and Medical Students will learn to identify important landmarks and approaches for sports medicine related surgery. This will include discussions on the decision-making process for each procedure as well as the pearls and pitfalls.

<u>Experimental Techniques</u>: Fellows, Residents, Medical Students and Attendings will have the opportunity to perform experimental surgical techniques or modifications in an effort to glean preliminary data for future research experiments. This will allow the surgeon to practice and perfect new techniques and foster new research projects.

By the end of the session, each Fellow, Resident and Medical Students will be able to successfully identify important surgical landmarks and know the pearls and pitfalls for each procedure.

Participation in Team and outside athletic events
